It is evident that transportation touches most of the other theme areas. Transit will likely be working more closely with the Changing Populations theme area to collaborate on the Human Services Transit Coordination Plan.

List any Goals or Recommendations within the plan that your team of theme Champions are struggling to address?

In the very short term, the lack of a bonding bill from the MN Legislature has put the hold on a few projects (we will have to wait to see how this ripples through the economy in the months ahead). This situation highlights the need for a more consistent, predictable funding stream / mechanism for our transportation needs

Transit seems to show up in several of our Recommendations and Action Steps. I am not as tuned into this area as Staci and Andy are. I do know ours is a rather rural Region (compared to say, St. Cloud, the Twin Cities, Duluth, or Rochester) – so I have to believe transit can be even more of a challenge than it is in these other areas.

Our State Legislature not getting a realistic transportation funding bill is disappointing. Perhaps it is time for the Resilient Region to begin writing letters to our State representatives.
